Education is an important aspect of this contribution and St George's Cathedral Education Centre provides a valuable extension of a tradition that can be traced back to the medieval period.

Explore the practical and discuss the incredible

For students of all ages - explore the bells, the architectural spaces, the treasures, the crypt and chapels, discuss the incredible with a variety of presenters, historians and philosophers.

St George's Cathedral welcomes people of all faiths and none, and is known for encouraging an enquiring conversation, and welcomes discussions with students on any aspect of spirituality, faith and Anglicanism.

Programmes are designed to meet any of your needs. They may be specific with regards to curriculum council units or devised especially for you.

We will work with you to create full, half-day or two hour programmes to meet the specific interests of your group. Programmes can be designed for younger or older students or a combination of both.

A warm welcome awaits staff and students who visit St George's. Students are encouraged to explore, question and enjoy their time with us. Sessions are interactive, informal and student-centred.

EXPERIENCE A LIVING TRADITION

The Cathedral Education Centre offers opportunity for students to discover and experience the sacred space and unique heritage of St George's Cathedral.

A visit to the Cathedral is rich with possibility:

- why a Cathedral? Did you know that Perth only became a City because St George's was created a Cathedral?
- Explore the building its architecture, including the bell tower and crypt, and artefacts, including rich robes, tapestries and treasures
- Hear the stories the people who lived and breathed the Cathedral's history
- Engage your senses music, textures, colours, light, artworks, incense
- Enter into mystery symbolism and rituals of the Cathedral
- Experience Sanctuary a space for stillness, silence, prayer and meditation
- Cabin Fever?

 Perhaps a dose of meditation would be in order.

 Opportunities are created for students to inhabit and be comfortable with stillness and silence, to experience a sense of awe and wonder and to enter into sacred space.

ABOUT ST GEORGE'S CATHEDRAL

The Cathedral's gothic revival design is enhanced by a blend of local and imported materials, including local jarrah roof trusses and arches, limestone from Fremantle, bricks manufactured in three different brickyards along the Swan River, bluestone pillars from Victoria, Oregon pine ceilings, marble reredos manufactured in Italy with English alabaster inserts and a Caen stone pulpit carved in France.

Within the Cathedral are numerous icons, beautiful stained glass windows and memorials to Western Australian pioneers, community leaders and those who served in the wars of the twentieth century. The Soldiers' Chapel is a place of special interest.

The Cathedral's peal of bells, founded as a memorial to Queen Victoria, can be heard each Sunday before the 10.00am Choral Eucharist and 5.00pm Choral Evensong. These services also feature the widely acclaimed Cathedral Choir. This historic Cathedral in the heart of the city offers traditional Anglican worship, challenging preaching, and a lively Christian community for people of all ages.
